	Purpose: The purpose was to assess the operations of WSCSB – TARAT ESTATE against the requirements of the Malaysia Sustainable Palm Oil (MSPO) certification under the Standard MS2530-3:2013.
	<b>ORGANIZATIONAL BRIEF</b>
	This is Surveillance Year 03 Certification Audit and the Scope is Individual Certification of WSCSB – TARAT ESTATE under the standards MSPO-3:2013 General Principles for Oil Palm Plantation and Organized smallholders.

WSCSB – TARAT ESTATE [WSCSB-TE] main office is located at N0 449, Heights Drive Commercial Centre, Jalan Stutong 93350 Kuching Sarawak while the plantation site is located at NCR LAND, KAMPUNG TARAT, KAWASAN SUNGAI IGOM, MS 26/50, ENSENGEI, BUKAR SADONG LAND DISTRICT, 94700, SAMARAHAN, SARAWAK, MALAYSIA [Geo-coordinates **N1.237556, E110.535750**]; approximately 55 km from Kuching City; accessible by land; about 55 minutes driving journey using the Pan Borneo Highway. The plantation is established in January **2011** and currently the total Certified Area is **377.30** hectares while total Planted Area is **377.30** hectares; with **13** planting blocks and **56,028** palm stand count. The land topography is generally flat and undulating with soil type shallow peat & sandy loam and some areas with mineral soil.

The main activities of **WSCSB-TE** are to produce, transport and sale of sustainable fresh fruit bunches [FFB]. At the site **WSCSB-TE** currently employ 38 people (comprising 2 office staffs and 36 workers). Main resources and amenities are currently shared with sister estates [Besrichas Sdn Bhd & Gemilang Bumimas Sdn Bhd]

The assessment method used in this audit follows the principle of three (3) Ps (paper, practice and people).

This certification assessment is a sampling process where management systems effectiveness and efficiency are confirmed via Audit Trail that the Auditor established to make an accurate conclusion. Information and data were systematically gathered and documented from interviews (with a cross section random sample of stakeholders), observations of process and activities, field audit and review of documentations and records. Assessments were done at the Plantation Office and field sites.

During the Audit, interviews were conducted with stakeholders comprising staff, workers and surrounding local community to find out their understanding of MSPO principles, its' importance to sustainable growth and production of oil palm products.

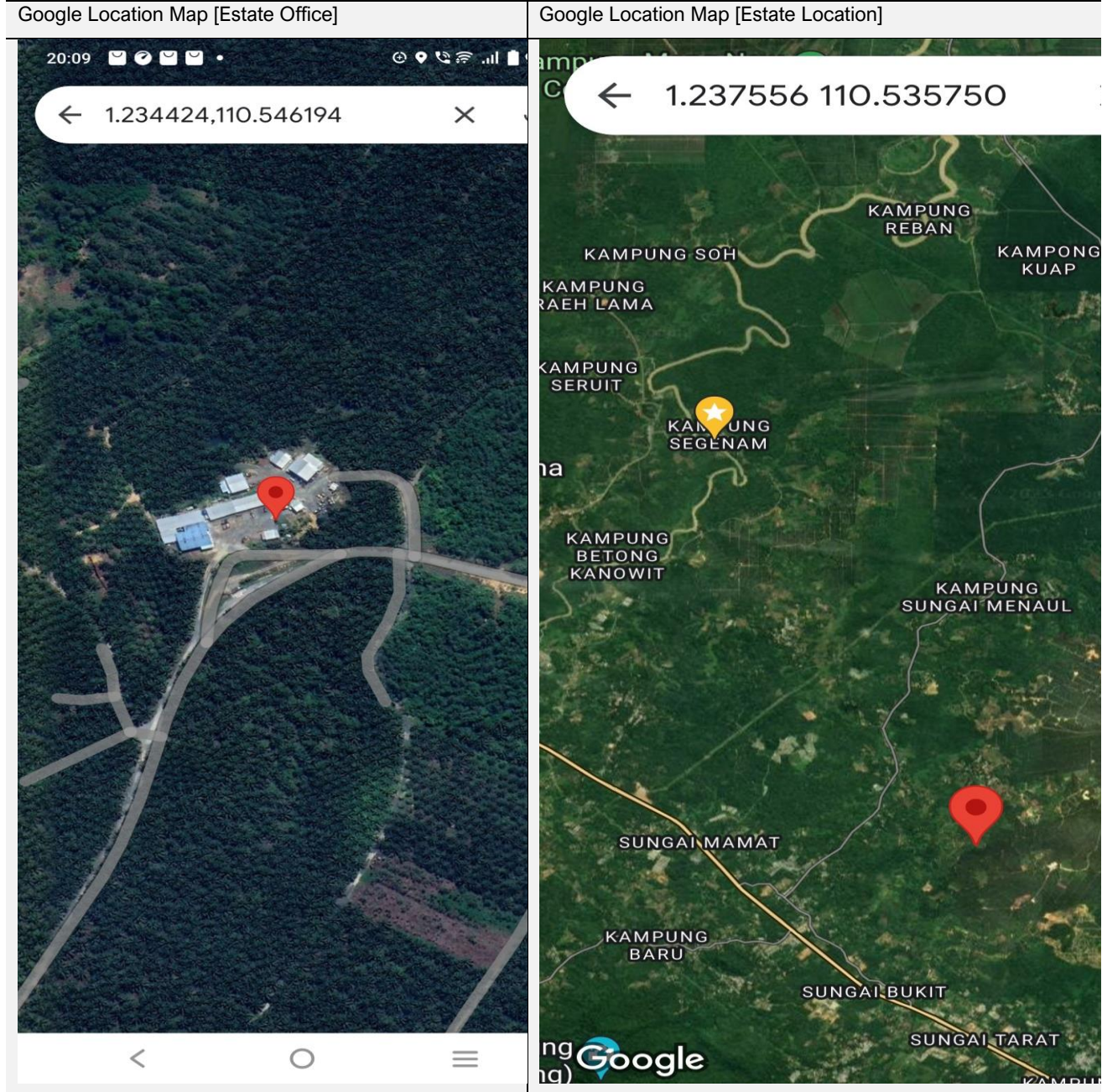
Other notable findings during the audit are the following:

- a) There existed good working relationship between the management, staff and workers;
- b) Workers are provided with habitable housing & living conditions with adequate facilities and amenities. The accommodation, water supply and electricity are provided free of charge.
- c) Internet / satellite services is adequately available in estate office and most other areas within the estate.
- d) Use of solar energy is well established with solar panels installed at estate office & workers quarters
- e) Staff and workers are remunerated above minimum Wage Order 2022. Salaries of staff / workers range from RM1,600 to RM3,000 per month
- f) Other benefits include medical and annual bonus and paid home leave. Medical treatment [for normal ailment] is provided free by employer.
- g) There is no evidence that the estate is processing non-sustainable FFB



The Audit team has conducted a rigorous assessment of BSB through Field Audit Checklist, Audit Report Checklist, documents review and Stakeholder’s Consultation. It is evidenced that BSB has complied and conformed to MSPO2530-3:2013 Certification Standards, conditions and requirements.

- e) Salaries earned range from RM1,600 to RM2,500 per month.
- f) Estates allow the local communities to use estate road to go to their farms

## 8. AUDIT SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

The audit team concludes that the organization fulfil the requirements of the **MS 2530-3:2013** standard and demonstrated the ability of the system to systematically achieve agreed requirements for products or services within the scope and the organization’s policy and objectives.

It is to be noted that site management of the Estate is well managed and generally well conformed and complied with requirements of the MSPO Standards.

The audit team recommends that, MSPO Certification be: **GRANTED**, to **WSCSB – TARAT ESTATE**
